- Green ERA-Hub (GEH)
- Started in **September 2022**, GEH is a Coordination and Support Action of the European Commission under the Horizon Europe Programme.
- It includes *partners from 15 ERA-Net initiatives* in the agri-food and biotechnology sectors, aimed at enhancing cross-sectoral collaboration and funding joint research projects.

Global Research Alliance on Agricultural Greenhouse Gases (GRA)

- Founded in **2009**, GRA brings countries together to find ways to reduce greenhouse gas emissions from agriculture.
- It involves over 60 countries and 20 partner organizations to *expand knowledge and develop mitigation technologies for agricultural emissions*.

Wheat Initiative (WI)

- •Launched in **2011** by the G20 Agriculture Ministeries, WI sets global strategic priorities for wheat research.
- •It promotes communication between researchers, funders, and policymakers, supporting *long-term* investments in wheat research.

As a result of the **alignment** of various national and regional research programmes, the GEH has **combined** the research and innovation priorities of different ERA-Net initiatives to launch the 2024 GEH Joint International Funding Call.

The WI supported GEH in the *definition of the call scope* and in the *involvement of international funders.* The GRA also, promoted the call among funders from their network in order to reach additional international funders.

Main Scope

The main objectives include advancing climate-smart farming, enhancing resilience to stresses, and ensuring the economic sustainability of farming.

The call seeks to support projects:

- developing innovative, sustainable, and resilient crop and livestock systems to adapt to and mitigate climate change and scientific methods for sustainability assessment, optimization of ecosystem services, and enhancement of biodiversity in primary production
- *Adopting* a *holistic and integrated perspective,* addressing both organic and conventional farming.

Key areas include *breeding and variety development*, *ecosystem interactions*, and *impact pathway analysis*.

Call Topics

• Topic 1. Improved resilience and health of crops:

The scope includes projects focused on *temperate, rain-fed, and irrigated environments*, often involving cereals like wheat and barley, along with brassicas, grain legumes, rotational grasslands, and perennial crops. Research aims to *improve agronomic systems* through *genetic and innovative breeding methods* and *crop management practices to achieve resilience*, *reduced inputs*, *water use efficiency*, and *improved agrobiodiversity and soil health*.

• Topic 2. Livestock production and climate change:

The focus is *on livestock, GHGs, and climate change*, addressing (a) adaptation strategies for livestock systems, and (b) improved GHG emission measurement systems. This includes beef and dairy cattle, pigs, poultry, and small ruminants. Key interventions include *holistic adaptation strategies for climate change, innovative breeding, feed supply, nutrition, and housing,* as well as advanced measurement systems for emissions throughout the livestock value chain.

Funding modalities and who can apply

- Not cofund from Europe

- Universities
- Higher education institutions
- Public research institutions
- Private non-profit organizations

 - Australia and partner countries count as 2 countries

PPOEs:

- Do not count towards minimum partners number
- Budget: Max 70% from one country
- Check national/regional funding limits

Project Duration:

- Minimum: 24 months
- Maximum: 36 months (check national/regional regulations for exceptions)

PPOE Letters of Commitment:

- Required at pre-registration phase
- Absence results in rejection of proposal

National/Regional Elegibility

Look at National Regulations of all countries in your conosortium at <u>submission</u>-greenerahub.eu)

Double check what documents are requested and which national eligibility criteria are there:

- Align to national priorities
- Maximum amount of resources available for each partner in a country
- Specific administrative rules
- Specific requirements for partners eligibility

IF ONLY ONE PARTNER FROM YOUR CONSORTIA RESULT NOT ELIGIBLE AT NATIONALL/REGIONAL LEVEL ALL CONSORTIUM WILL BE CONSIDERED INELIGIBLE AND WILL BE REJECTED

Eligibility Check:

- Failure to meet any criteria leads to rejection of proposal
- e.g. Non-eligible partner without Letter of Commitment leads to rejection of the whole proposal

Advisory and Evaluation Process

- Contact NCP: Strongly advised to contact before submission (see Annex A), unless otherwise specified in national/regional regulations.
- Post-Submission: Call Office checks general eligibility
- Not-compliant proposals are rejected (consultation with Founders Board)
- Founder Boards checks against National/Regional Eligibility Criteria
- Only proposals meeting both General and National/Regional Eligibility Criteria proceed to evaluation.
- Communication: Eligibility check results communicated before evaluation phase

Coordinator of the research project consortium

- Confirm national/regional regulations and funding modalities with all partners
- Guarantee eligibility of the entire project throughout the application procedure
- Responsible for pre-registration and proposal submission
- Create account on the online submission platform
- Central contact point for the consortium
- Responsible for project coordination throughout its lifespan

Coordinator of the research project consortium

- Inform about events affecting project implementation
- Ensure high standards of work
- Meet contractually bound deliverables and milestones
- Disseminate all relevant information to consortium partners
- Monitor data
- Ensure timely delivery of project reports
- Financial management handled directly by consortium members and their corresponding Funding Parties

- Must pre-register by the deadline indicated in the document
- Mandatory for full proposal submission
- Applicants missing the pre-registration deadline cannot submit full proposals

Pre – registration of projects

Flexibility After Pre-Registration

• Can add, delete, or replace proposal partners after pre-registration

Consortia Requirements at Pre-Registration:

- Minimum three eligible partners
- Requesting funding from at least three different FB member countries contributing to the Call

Purpose of Pre-Registration: Supports Call Office in preparation for evaluation phase

- Contacting required experts
- Projects will not undergo expert evaluation
- General check against the number and type of partners

Submission of Proposals

One-Step Process:

- Deadline: 5 September 2024, 12:00 CEST (noon, Berlin, Germany)
- Online submission platform
- Proposals not pre-registered in time will be rejected
- BEFORE the deadline: Update and resubmit as many times as needed
- Not possible after submission deadline

Submission of Proposals

- Submit Early to avoid last-minute technical problems
- High traffic volumes expected near the deadline
- No deadline extensions are allowed for technical issues
- Ensure all consortium partners are eligible for support from respective funding organizations
- For PPOE partners, ensure financial capacity via a Letter of Financial Commitment (Annex E)
- Coordinator's Role: Responsible for timely submission via the online system

Expert Evaluation Procedure

- 1. Evaluation Committee (IEC) Mandate
- Responsibilities:
 - Peer review proposals based on defined criteria
 - Provide a written summary for FB and for applicants sent by the Call Office
 - Propose a ranking list of proposals based on scores
- 2. Committee Structure
- Chair: Coordinates IEC work
- Members: Independent of Funding Parties and applicants
- Conflict of Interest:
 - IEC members sign Conflict of Interest and Declaration of Confidentiality forms
 - Online tool prevents access to conflicted proposals

Expert evaluation procedure

3. Confidentiality

- Strict confidentiality of:
 - Applicant identities
 - Proposal content
- Access restricted to FB, IEC, and Call Office
- Data handled per GDPR
- 4. Evaluation Process
- Eligible Proposals:
 - Evaluated by at least three international experts
 - Consensus scores determined in meetings

Evaluation and Selection of Proposals

Evaluation Criteria

- Scientific Excellence:
 - Clarity of objectives, soundness of concept, methodology credibility, consortium quality, innovation, interdisciplinary approaches
- Relevance and Potential Impact:
 - Relevance to Call scope and topics, project impact potential
- Quality and Efficiency of Implementation:
 - Work plan quality, management structure, participant complementarity, task allocation, project budget appropriateness

Scoring

- Scale: o to 5 (no half scores)
 - o: Fails to address criterion
 - 1: Poor
 - 2: Fair
 - 3: Good
 - 4: Very Good
 - 5: Excellent
- Thresholds:
 - Criteria score < 3/5: Not recommended for funding
 - Total score < 10: Not proposed for funding

Outcome

- Ranking: Proposals ranked by final scores
- Final Decision:
 - Made by FB based on ranking and available funding
 - Communicated by the Call Office to the project coordinators (Evaluation summaries will be provided to the coordinators which are responsible for forwarding all information to the proposal partners.)
 - Funded projects list published

Ethics Evaluation Procedure

Two-Step Process

- Step 1: Ethics Screening
 - Outcomes: Full Clearance, Conditional Clearance, Ethics Assessment
- Step 2: Ethics Assessment
 - In-depth analysis
 - Outcomes: Full Clearance, Conditional Clearance, No Ethics Clearance

Obligations for funded projects

- Process:
 - Notification letter received
 - Contact Funding Parties for grant negotiation
